### National Donate Life Month, April 2017

The symbol for National Donate Life month is the pinwheel. The pinwheel is symbolic of an instrument that turns obstacles into opportunities. The pinwheel's ability to capture and pass on energy parallels one's potential to make LIFE possible. Each Donate Life Pinwheel has four sails supported by one stem, symbolizing the power one person has to be an organ, eye, tissue or living donor. For recipients, donation can turn sickness and injury into a second chance at life. For donors, their decision to register can turn a sorrowful time into a source of comfort for family as a result of renewed life for others.

A pinwheel reminds us that we all have the potential to capture life and pass on life, comfort and hope to others by registering as a donor. This April you are encouraged to stop and feel the breeze, watch the pinwheels and think of the lives of those touched by donation and transplantation.

#### Dogs:

Must be on leash



Rabies vaccine at / after 4 months of age

Booster at one year

Older dogs need rabies vaccine every three years

Bring Proof (previous rabies certificate) of previous rabies vaccinations in order to get three year vaccine.



#### Cats:

Must be in carriers

Rabies vaccination at / after 4 months

Booster at one year

Older cats need vaccinations every three years
