Please take a critical look at your property and see if you fall in the category of neglecting to keep your yard free of weeds. Many homes in town are looking pretty shaggy from the overgrown weeds in our yards and especially in the alleys. It is the homeowners responsibility to keep their section of the alley clean. Your section of the alley means from the middle of the alley to your yard property lines it is your responsibility, not the city's. The city does grade the alley & does some spraying but weed control is the responsibility of the homeowner or tenant. Red tags are going out to property owners who do not take care of their responsibility. Tickets follow after the red tag if clean up is not done.

Just a reminder to all citizens, FENCE PERMITS are required before you put a fence up in your yard! City ordinance does not allow fences to be built out of pallets. Fences are also not allowed on city right-of-ways. Make sure you know where your property lines are before building a fence. Property pins should be on the corners of your property, are sometimes hard to find, but try using a metal detector. The city does not mark your property lines, so a professional may need to be called in by you to help you find your property lines. Always call in a dig line before you start digging post holes. Dig Line is free and can save a lot of headaches on where not to dig. Idaho Dig Line # is 811 or 1-800-342-1585. A fence permit is \$30.00. Call City Hall if you have questions 536-5161.
