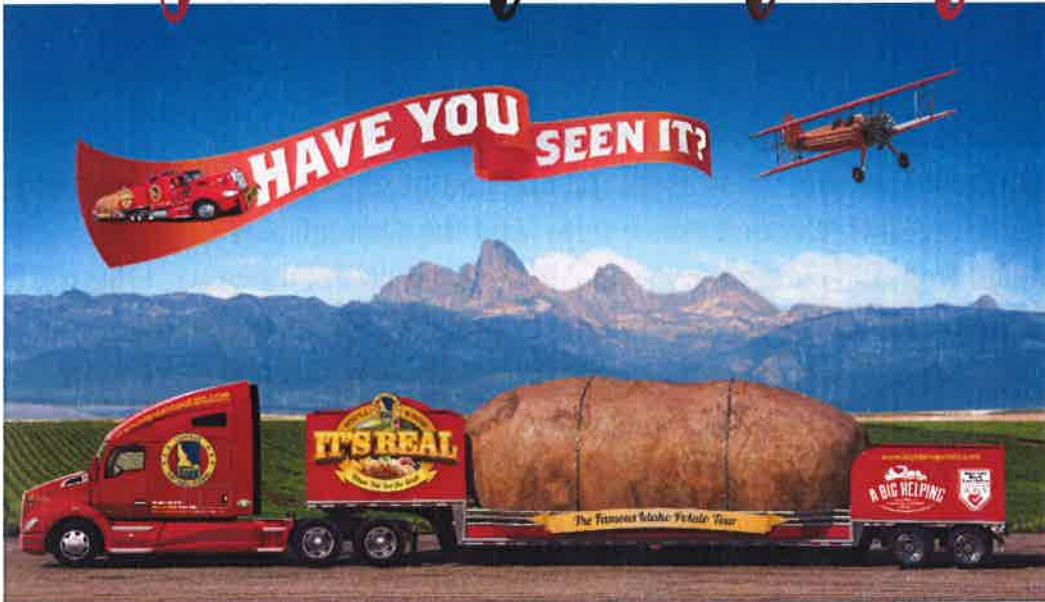

NO dogs allowed in City Park during Dairy Days and Independence Day Celebration

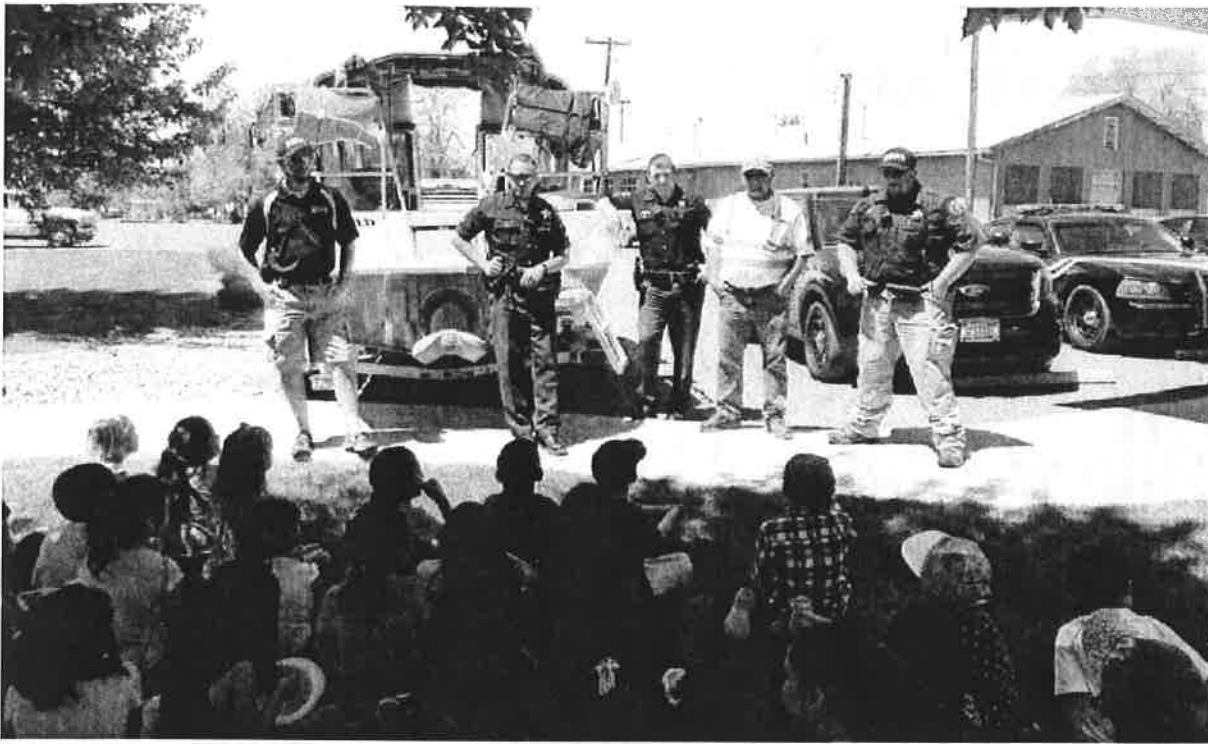
